SUPPORTING DATA:

The purpose of this report is for the Board to take action on setting the number of spaces for the acceptance of open enrollment students for the 2025-26 school year.

The Board considers a number of factors when determining the number of spaces available for open enrollment:

- The District strives to maintain class sizes of 22 students in grades K-3 and 25 students in grades 4-12.
- The number of enrolled students who will need special education programming;
- DPI guidance for special education programs;
- For Kindergarten enrollment, the number of students enrolled by January 17, 2025 and the
 history of enrollments between May and August. The three-year average is approximately 37
 new students registering for Kindergarten between May and August;
- Historical residential growth and new developments in the District; and
- Non-resident students once admitted do not have to re-apply pursuant to Board Policy 314, so these students are included in the current enrollment numbers;

For the 2025-2026 school year, we recommend the Board approve the spaces in Table 1, Column E. We also recommend that there is no space in grades 4K-12 for open enrolled students with disabilities who need special education programming, including the related services of OT, PT, and Speech, given our students' current needs and our projections for future special education needs in

the fall.

Should we have additional space after monitoring our enrollment and student programming needs this spring, the Board may approve additional open enrollment spaces in June. Should our open enrollment application number exceed our space available, the District will establish a wait list in accordance with state law and Board Policy 314.

You should note there are 31 open enrolled seniors who we anticipate will graduate, so there is a budget impact if the total number of open enrolled students is not maintained or increased. In 2024-25, we received \$8,962 per open enrolled student without special education programming. We do not have the allocation yet for 2025-26.

SUPPORTING DATA:

The Wisconsin Association of School Business Officials (WASBO) and the Wisconsin Association of School Board (WASB) recommend that every Wisconsin Board of Education approve a budget development timeline to ensure clarity and consistency of the budget development process.

Even with the utilization of a budget development timeline, the process still includes two unknown variables. Those variables include:

- The Approval of the 2025-2027 Biennial State Budget
 - Over the last decade the contents of the state budget have become a much larger determinant of how many resources are available to school districts in Wisconsin. Prior to 2009-2010 that was not the case. Prior to 2009, there was a formula that provided a significant degree of predictability in per pupil funding as increases were indexed to the Consumer Price Index (CPI).

Since 2009-2010 the State of Wisconsin has failed to provide adequate annual per pupil increases to the revenue limit. These increases are essential because of the impact of inflation related to wage increases for our staff in a very tight labor market. We also experience inflationary pressures in the cost of goods and services we use through normal operations. Inadequate funding has led Wisconsin school districts to continually ask constituents to approve referendum over-rides to the revenue limit formula in order to survive. The Wisconsin Association of School Boards estimates that the legislative failure to allocate sufficient funds to keep up with the CPI has resulted in a loss of over \$3,800 per student in resources over the past 15 years.

The Governor attempted to provide some level of predictability by using a partial veto in the 2023-25 budget to allow a \$325 increase in revenue per pupil each year. That amount, while appreciated, still did not equal the deficiency caused by the lack of CPI indexed

school funding increases. Unfortunately, even that \$325 increase in revenue per pupil is now in question as the method the Governor used to provide that certainty is under review by the State Supreme Court. A ruling is anticipated at any time.

- Special Education Categorical Funding Reimbursement Percentage.
 - o For the 2023-2025 biennial state budget, the special education categorical funding reimbursement percentage was supposed to be 33% of expenditures in year 2 of the budget. This formula is based on prior year expenses submitted to the Department of Public Instruction (DPI). Once audited data is received, DPI takes the eligible expenses and divides them into the allocation provided by the State Legislature to achieve a percentage that is applied to the submitted prior year expenses. In December, we found out that the amount of the allocation provided was inadequate to achieve the 33% amount. In fact, the percentage of special education categorical funding reimbursement is now estimated to be approximately 29%. This leads to a budgetary deficit in the special education fund of \$150,000 in the 2024-25 budget for Oregon School District.

The spring and summer may bring some certainty to the impact of the State 2025-2027 budget.

The following timeline is proposed for the Board of Education's consideration.

February	Board Budget Work Session is held to discuss the assumptions used to build the 25-26 budget
March	Board considers approval of the Initial Preliminary Budget, Staffing, and Capital Maintenance Plan
April - August	Board receives budget updates based on changing state level budget information
September	Board considers approval of the Preliminary Budget at the OSD Annual Meeting
October	Board considers approval of the Original Budget
