We thank all veterans for their service and sacrifice.





PVE Students Learn About Democracy Vote Here Today I Mr. 2 Vote Here


Third graders in Mrs. Janssens class at Prairie View Elementary learned about our democratic process by voting in their classroom. A great example of relevant learning experiences.
