The purpose of the Superintendent Report is to give the Board a high-level overview of what is going on across the district.




We're so proud of their creativity and enthusiasm for learning about the rainforest's incredible biodiversity!


Congratulations to our students who were recently inducted into the National Honor Society! We are so proud of you!
