Congratulations to OHS educator, Dave Ebert, who is a recipient of the Presidential Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching (PAEMST). PAEMST awards are the nation's highest honors for teachers of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics! Each year, up to 110 outstanding educators from across the country may be recognized by the White House for their passion, dedication, and impact in the classroom; approximately 50 of these are for math.

Mr. Ebert was nominated for the award in 2017 and after a rigorous selection process, was named a finalist in 2021, and was selected as the recipient of the Presidential Award earlier this month.

In addition to this prestigious honor, Mr. Ebert will receive a certificate signed by the President, a \$10,000 award from the National Science Foundation, and an all-expenses paid trip to a recognition event in Washington D.C. While in D.C., Mr Ebert will participate in professional development activities and network with fellow STEM educators from across the nation.


