


Q1 Your student(s) currently attends which grade level(s) in the Oregon School District? (Please select all that apply.)


Q2 Do you currently work for the Oregon School District?

Q3 If we are able to schedule a break for students in fall, which days do you prefer?



Q4 If we are able to schedule a break for students in February, which days do you prefer?



Q5 Which week do you prefer for spring break?





The District values the whole child and understands that the health and well-being of students is a significant contributor to their academic achievement. In an effort to improve access to mental health services for students who might otherwise have a barrier to services, the District may approve a student receiving mental health services while in school buildings. The District may not approve a student receiving physical health services while in school buildings except through school staff or District approved programs.

723.02 Definitions

723.02.1 - Mental health services means therapy or counseling meant to support a student's emotional, psychological, and/or social well-being.

723.02.2 - In-Person Therapy means the therapy is delivered by the student's mental health professional while in-person at school.

723.02.3 - Teletherapy means the therapy is delivered by the student's mental health professional through different media that are not in-person, such as over the phone, video conferencing, or via the internet.

723.02.4 - OSD Approved Provider means a provider who has partnered with the District to provide therapy, counseling or other mental health services to students and has signed an agreement with the District.

723.03 OSD Approved Providers

723.03.01 - The District has partnered with certain agencies to provide mental health services to students. The providers have a signed agreement with the District. They provide mental health services to students both in school and outside of school, either through in-person or via teletherapy. They provide discounted rates to underinsured or uninsured students, and work with the District to offer financial support to students in need.

723.03.2 - If a student requires mental health services at school, all efforts shall be made to secure an OSD Approved Provider.

723.03.3 - Families who are interested in these services should contact their school's student services office. A list of OSD Approved Providers can be found in Appendix A.

723.04 Teletherapy with Non-OSD Approved Providers

723.04.1 - If a student requires mental health services at school, and they are not able to secure an OSD Approved Provider, then the District will evaluate whether it can approve Teletherapy for the student from a Non-OSD Approved Provider.

723.04.2 - Families who are interested in their student receiving Teletherapy while in the school building shall follow the process described in the administrative guidelines below.

723.05 In-Person Therapy with Non-OSD Approved Providers

723.05.1 - If Teletherapy is not an good option for the student, and the student requires mental health services at school, the District will evaluate whether it can approve In-Person Therapy for the student from a non-OSD Provider.

723.05.2 - Families who are interested in their student receiving In-Person Therapy while in the school building shall follow the process described in the administrative guidelines below.

723.06 – Mental health services provided in the school buildings will be coordinated by the Director of student Services, who shall implement administrative guidelines in accordance with this Policy and as approved by the District Superintendent.

723.07 - The District reserves all rights to suspend and/or terminate any health services provided in school buildings at any time and for any reason without penalty. The District shall provide notice in writing to the Parent/Guardian and/or a student age 18 or older.

723.06 Mental Health Services In School Buildings

723.06.1 - District Responsibilities

- 1. OSD Approved Providers will have priority over other providers for private spaces for mental health services.
- 2. The District has limited space and will prioritize requests based on student needs.
- 3. The District will make reasonable efforts to provide a private space for mental health services. The District cannot guarantee that the space will be confidential.

723.06.2 - Parent/Guardian and Student Responsibilities

- 1. A parent/guardian seeking mental health services for their student at school should first contact their student services office to evaluate whether the services are required at school and whether the student may see an OSD Approved Provider.
- If the student requires mental health services while at school, and is not able to secure an OSD Approved Provider, the parent/guardian with legal custody should complete the SOSD Request for School Based Mental Health Services
- 3. If approved, the parent/guardian must provide a copy to the Provider.
- The parent/guardian must sign a release for student services staff to communicate with the Provider in order to coordinate care and support.
- 5. The parent/guardian should contact student services at least 10 school days in advance to reserve a private space for the teletherapy with the understanding that space is limited and may not always be available.
- 6. The Parent/Guardian shall make reasonable efforts to schedule appointments during the student's non-instructional time.
- 7. If technology is needed for the appointment, the Parent/Guardian and/or student is responsible for the technology. The District is unable to provide technology support or make adjustments to its internet filter to allow for teletherapy access.
- 8. The District is not responsible for any loss or damage to the student's personal property.
- 9. The student is responsible for remembering to attend the appointment, and for returning to class in a timely fashion.
- 10. The parent/guardian understands that their student will not be supervised by school staff during the appointment and accepts sole responsibility for the student during this time.

723.06.3 - Provider Responsibilities

- The Provider must review and follow the
 OSD Request for School Based Mental Health Services
- 2. The Provider must have successfully completed a background check found here: <u>Volunteer Information / Home</u>
- 3. The Provider must agree to contact the student's main office if the student is in crisis during the session or needs additional support to return to their classroom and be ready for learning.
- 4. The Provider must partner with student services staff to support the student, and treat all school staff and students respectfully and professionally.
- 5. The District is not responsible for any damages, injuries or loss to the Provider's persons or property while the Provider or its employees are on school property.
