

The OHS Dance Team has been dazzling crowds with their dance performances, and anyone who has seen these performances can tell that practice is really paying off!



The theme that runs through all of it is the involvement of our excellent educators - they are there every step of the way to join our students and make it a great week.


The OHS Pep Assembly energized students and staff!
